Though money didn't flow as freely as the rain that winter, my parents worked with joyful anticipation to give my brother and me a Christmas present we would never forget. They scrimped for months and then spent more than they could probably afford for a Marx electric train.



Then the day before Christmas, a cousin stationed at a nearby military base pulled into the driveway. Opening the trunk of his car he lifted out a large heavy box. My brother and I could hardly wait to see what it was. On Christmas morning we opened it first. Eagerly we unwrapped an expensive new electric train set. Wow! You had to pull us down off the ceiling. A Lionel train, too! Then we opened the presents from our parents--another electric train. Ho hum. And not nearly as extravagant as the one from our cousin. Guess whose we played with most?

Mom and Dad were hurt. The outlay for an unmarried Air Force lieutenant was nothing compared to the sacrifice my parents had made. But all we saw was the glamour of an expensive train. We counted our parents' gift as merely a nice accessory.

Our heavenly Father spends many a disappointing Christmas. Missions News

Over the past year, I have been working with several teachers and other school leaders at Black Forest Academy in the area of providing a holistic Christian education to our students. This includes working with our high school teachers as they develop lessons to help students with social and emotional learning. These lessons include things like- how to have a difficult conversation with a friend, showing kindness to others, and developing good listening skills.

The mission of the school is to provide an education to students that equips them to influence their world through Biblical thought, character, and action. 
"Sweet Symbol

Car Care Corner By Gabriel





Does anyone here want better gas mileage? Some easy math will help you track your MPGs, the best place to start driving with fuel efficiency in mind if you don't already. A lot of newer cars have an MPG indicator built in and this simple trick will show you how accurate it is (I've found them to be a bit optimistic!).

When you pull up to the gas pump, reset the trip odometer on your car to zero and fill your tank until the pump shuts off. Don't "top off" the tank! On top of throwing off the accuracy of your mileage calculation, doing so can damage your emissions system and lead to costly repairs. If you're curious, "topping off" can spill liquid gas into an emissions control device designed exclusively for managing fuel vapors, thus fouling an expensive component that will need to be replaced to turn off the Check Engine Light (CEL).

Anyway, after your trip-tracked refill, just drive like normal until it's time to fill up again. When you stop at the pump this time, check that trip odometer. Let's say it says 304.6 miles. Write that down and reset the trip odometer for next time. When the fuel pump shuts itself off, write down how many gallons you just bought. If the pump says you put in 8.129 gallons, then you have all the data you need for an MPG check.

Divide the trip-meter mileage by gallons of gas you put in to see your average mileage from your last refill. In my example, that would be 304.6 miles / 8.129 gallons which would give you 37.47 MPG! Then you can divide the cost per gallon by your miles per gallon to see your per mile fuel cost. At \$3 per gallon with an average of 37 MPG, your average cost was 8 cents per mile.

Of course your mileage will vary, but in upcoming articles I'll share techniques to optimize your fuel efficiency that apply to all common passenger vehicles. While your pickup truck will never sip gas like my compact car (and under "towing" in my owners manual, it simply says "not recommended!"), the same techniques can provide a financially impactful benefit if you travel far or often.

Making a habit of checking your fuel consumption can also provide early warning of potential problems. A sudden dip in your fuel consumption without much change to your driving habits can indicate issues that need to be addressed before they become bigger expenses. You can expect a few MPGs lower on average during the winter, but vacuum leaks, failing sensors, clogged components, and other issues could increase your fuel consumption considerably before tripping the worry symbol. Your fuel economy can function like a coal mine canary!

If you have a 1996 or newer vehicle, then you have an On-Board Diagnostic (OBD) port under your dash. If you have a 1995 or older, I'd like to see it! But there are devices available that can plug into this port to provide you with an MPG indicator among other useful functions such as helping you figure out why that CEL is on. A popular device of this kind that I have enjoyed in the past is called the Scan Gauge II, or search "OBD scan tools" for a wide variety of alternatives.

Next time we will take a look at some driving habits that can boost those MPGs and save you money!


Join us as we celebrate the birth of our savior, Christ Jesus, throughout December. There will be something for everyone to enjoy.

Listening to the Christmas story as the choir presents the cantata,






